EAACI is a non-profit association of clinicians, researchers and allied health professionals, dedicated to improving the health of people affected by allergic diseases and asthma.



OUR FOCUS AND CHALLENGE

At the beginning of the 20th century, allergy was viewed as a rare disease. Today, more than 150 million Europeans suffer from chronic allergic diseases, and the current prediction is that by 2025 half of the entire EU population will be affected.

As well as being devastating for individuals who face a relentless impairment of their quality of life, dealing with these patients imposes a significant cost on national health systems. Avoidable indirect costs of failure to properly treat allergy in the EU are estimated to range between 55 and 151 billion Euros per annum.

EAACI's diverse range of activities aim to bridge the existing knowledge gap on allergic and immunologic diseases among nonspecialists, raising awareness of their effects on patients' well-being, and advocating policy changes.





Allergy

Allergy is one of the leading journals in the field of Allergy and Clinical Immunology, ranking 4th in Allergy and with an impact factor of 6.771.



Pediatric Allergy and Immunology

The Pediatric Allergy and Immunology (PAI) is a leading journal in the field of pediatric allergy, ranking 4th in Pediatrics, 8th in Allergy and 46th in Immunology, and with an impact factor of 4.654.



Clinical and Translational Allergy


The Clinical and Translation Allergy (CTA) has been launched by EAACI in 2011 and it is EAACI's contribution to the most important way of publishing research - open access. With an impact factor of 4.232, CTA accepts scientific papers and reviews in the allergy field in both basic and clinical research.

Position papers

Represent the latest research of specific medical fields within allergology and are published in the Academy's official journals and at the EAACI Congress. Position Papers identify necessary actions to mitigate allergic reactions or highlight the need for interventions at the political level.

EAACI Global Atlases

To help guide health care professionals with a solid reference tool, EAACI has developed a series of Global Atlases: The Global Atlas of Skin Allergy, Asthma, Allergy and Allergic Rhinitis and Chronic Rhinosinusitis.









EAACI Molecular Allergology Users' Guide

The EAACI Molecular Allergology User's Guide describes what components are, the clinical benefits of testing for components, as well as how to interpret results including understanding cross-reactions. It contains 41 chapters written by 65 authors.

ICON - International Consensus On

EAACI, The American Academy of Allergy, Asthma and Immunology, the World Allergy Organisation and the American College of Allergy, Asthma and Immunology came together to improve the research of allergic diseases at a global level. ICONs function as consensus statements available to support medical decisions.

PRACTALL - Practical Allergology

A long standing collaboration between EAACI and AAAAI, the initiative seeks to develop consensus documents on topics of interest for practicing allergologists.



FOSTERING SCIENCE THROUGH DEDICATED EVENTS

Through a wide range of well-attended scientific events, EAACI provides an efficient and highly respected avenue for communication and knowledge-exchange in the field of allergy and immunology. It also builds links between stakeholders, pushes back scientific frontiers and raises the standards for professionalism, networking, dedication and innovation.

EAACI events engage world-renowned experts, promising new members, researchers and practitioners, as well as specialists and generalists in a productive exchange, advancing knowledge in the field.

EAACI Annual Congress

Features extensive multi-day scientific programmes, with up to **8'000** international delegates, making it **the largest Allergy Congress in Europe and worldwide** by number of participants and total number of submitted abstracts.

The Congress represents a dedicated platform for dialogue and knowledge dissemination. All stakeholders have a chance to discuss, present and impart good science as well as the latest insights and breakthroughs in the field.

Focused Meetings

EAACI organises several smaller meetings once every two years that provide a forum for discussion and in-depth understanding within targeted medical communities about specific topics. These mid-size events address key areas in the field of allergy and provide knowledge-sharing and training using various session formats, attracting delegates and speakers from around the world. With an attendance between 250 -1'500 participants depending on the topic area, these meetings also provide an excellent platform for networking with peers over a three-day period.













The European Strategic Forum on Allergic Diseases and Asthma:

Prioritising research challenges and funding for allergy and asthma and the need for translational research. EAACI organises the European Strategic Forum on Allergic Diseases and Asthma every other year, and brings together all relevant stakeholders and decision-makers in the field of allergy, asthma and clinical Immunology around an open debate on contemporary challenges and potential solutions for the next decade. The European Strategic Forum on Allergic Diseases brings together all partners who have the drive and the influence to make positive change: national and international societies, patients' organisations, regulatory bodies and industry representatives.

EDUCATING PROFESSIONALS

EAACI believes it is of paramount importance to uphold high standards of education in the field of allergy and immunology, and to keep allergy specialists as up to date as possible across Europe. Our activities have a strong educational focus and provide a basis of training to prepare future generations of professionals in our field.

Allergy Schools

EAACI holds Immunology and Allergy schools aimed at training and educating Europe's motivated young specialists in a highly interactive and effective networking environment. These training courses focus on a specific topic within allergy and are built to offer a solid foundation in this area. They are therefore attractive to individuals who are new to the field, for fellows in training, EAACI Junior Members, as well as professionals with a specific interest in the chosen topic. Limited group sizes of around 120 international participants enable great dialogue throughout these typically three-day courses.

Masterclasses in Allergy and Clinical Immunology

Covering both clinical and transitional topics of a specific field, EAACI Master Classes aim to dive deeper and therefore target professionals and specialists with a higher level of experience. Conducted in exclusive workshop formats of up to 60 international participants, they offer an excellent interactive platform for the exchange of knowledge over a two-day period.

Knowledge Examination in Allergy and Clinical Immunology

EAACI has held the European Examination in Allergology and Clinical Immunology annually since 2008. Many candidates from all over the world have already successfully passed the exam. Following the initiative of UEMS to standardise the training curriculum of allergologists and clinical immunologists in Europe, the EAACI Knowledge Exam aims to further improve the standards of our specialty by providing a European exam in allergology and clinical immunology.

Continuing Medical Education (CME)

EAACI has implemented a system of Continuing Medical Education (CME) in collaboration with the UEMS for accreditation of educational activities in the fields of Allergy and Immunology. It acts as an umbrella organisation for accreditation of external events as well as providing CME Credits for its own EAACI meetings, ensuring their high scientific value. Credits are also valid in the USA and Canada through an agreement between UEMS, the American Medical Association and the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada.

EAACI Clinical and Research Fellowships

Every year, EAACI awards a number of fellowships to Junior Members interested in increasing their knowledge and skills at Europe's leading scientific institutions.

RAISING AWARENESS AT THE EUROPEAN LEVEL

In recent years EAACI has led major public awareness campaigns on allergy, developed a series of public declarations on specific advocacy topics, and organized dedicated policy events in the European Parliament.



The European Parliament Interest Group on Allergy and Asthma

The European Parliament Interest Group on Allergy and Asthma was launched on 25 March 2015 as a result of a long-standing collaboration between the European Academy of Allergy and Clinical Immunology (EAACI), the European Federation of Allergy and Airways Diseases Patients' Associations (EFA), and a group of forward-thinking Members of the European Parliament (MEPs), who are committed to fight against allergy and asthma in Europe. The European Parliament Interest Group on Allergy and Asthma is a policy forum to share expertise and align interests engaging with EU policymakers and stakeholders on allergy and asthma health.

Collaborations at the EU level

EAACI has also joined forces with prominent alliances to unite its voice with those in the fields of chronic diseases and biomedical research.

- European Federation of Allergy and Airways Diseases Patients' Associations (EFA) to advocate better patient care
- European Chronic Disease Alliance (ECDA) to raise awareness among policy makers about the surge in chronic diseases
