

Late Abstract Submission –Terms & Conditions

Submission

- 1. By submitting this late abstract:
 - a. I understand that my late abstract, including names, is stored electronically and may be published by the Organising Committee on the EAACI website, EAACI content platform and the EAACI Digital Congress platform and as a dedicated supplement in the EAACI Journal Allergy (open access).
 - b. I understand that my personal data will be shared with EAACI, CYIM, the EAACI Committees, and late abstract reviewers involved in the late abstract selection for the EAACI Congress 2025. Transfer of personal data to contractors as well as EAACI related scientific organisations may occur for production, promotion and dissemination of congress content.
 - c. I understand that failure to present the late abstract will result in exclusion from online publishing on the EAACI website, EAACI content platform, EAACI Digital Congress platform and Allergy Journal.
 - d. I agree to transfer the copyright to EAACI/Wiley.
- 2. Authors can modify the author information, topic and core data of their late abstract directly on the submission system until the deadline given. Please be aware that there will be no extension possible.
- 3. Trade names are not allowed, as well as copyright and trademark symbols. Company names and logos are not allowed in the title but can be named in the authors' affiliation.
- 4. References, credits or the authors' academic degrees or grant support are not to be included in the late abstract.
- 5. Standard abbreviations may be employed in the text. Place special or unusual abbreviations in parentheses after the full wording at the first time it appears in the body of the text. Non-proprietary (generic) names of drugs, written in lowercase, are required the first time a drug is mentioned in the text.

Review and selection

1. All late abstracts will be blinded for review by a minimum of 3 members of the late abstract review committee. All the reviewers have been selected by the Scientific Programme Committee to review late abstracts in the category that best fits their expertise.

EAACI aims for good quality of science without compromising scientific integrity.

The late abstract reviewers are required to identify late abstracts pertaining to commercial



promotion of a proprietary product, data originating from the same study across several late abstracts in order to notify the Scientific Programme Committee.

Please note that the final decisions regarding the allocation and the type of presentation of the submitted late abstract will be made by the Scientific Programme Committee. **No rescheduling or changes by the submitters will be possible once the late abstract deadline is closed.**

The presenting author receives all correspondence concerning the late abstract and is responsible
for informing all co-authors of the status of the late abstract. The presenting author of a late
abstract must register for the meeting by the given deadline. If EAACI does not receive your
registration and payment by the deadline, your late abstract will be removed from the
programme.

Publication and consent

1. For the publication of a late abstract that contains identifiable information about patients (e.g. gender, age, illness, location) or images it is necessary that patients (or their parent or legal guardian) have given written informed consent for the research to be published.

By agreeing to these terms, I confirm that:

- a. For all late abstracts that include identifiable patient details (e.g. gender, age, illness, location) or images, written informed consent for the publication of these clinical details and/or clinical images was obtained from the patient/parent/guardian/ relative of the patient. (Please include an explanatory statement in your late abstract text).
- b. The final decision on whether consent to publish is required or not lies with EAACI.

2. Duplication of publications

Unpublished late abstracts that have been presented at a different scientific meeting within a 12-month period prior to EAACI Congress 2025, provided they contain updated/additional data, can be submitted and will be considered for presentation. Late abstracts submitted for publication or to a scientific meeting, but are pending acceptance, can be submitted without restrictions. However, once the late abstract has been accepted by EAACI it is automatically subject to the EAACI embargo guidelines.

3. Declaration of Conflict of Interest

EAACI is committed to ensuring the integrity of its scientific, educational, and research programmes. Late abstract submission requires disclosure of any financial or other interest that might be construed as resulting in an actual, potential, or apparent conflict. The submitter is responsible for obtaining disclosure information from all co-authors, to be entered in the author section of the submission page.
